POWASSAN AND DISTRICT UNION LIBRARY

As part of the agreement, dated May 15th 2001, between the 3 municipalities, it was agreed upon that the funding formula (Powassan 60%, Chisholm 20% and Nipissing 20%) be reviewed every 3 years. Chisholm has asked for this formula review multiple times over several years with no avail. Council of the Township of Chisholm has given their one year notice to withdrawal. Should our partners be ready to accept the provisions of the agreement, we would be open to discuss. Having library services for our residents is important to us.

BY-LAW 2019-28

Please be advised that there is a new by-law, being a By-Law of the Township of Chisholm to regulate the use and care of roads. The full By-Law can be found on the Township website page. By-law 2014-06 being a By-Law to prohibit the depositing of snow on any highway or bridge under the jurisdiction of the Township of Chisholm has been repealed and all snow related expectations are within the new By-Law 2019-28.

PULL THE PLUG ON ELECTRICAL FIRES THIS WINTER

Failing electrical equipment is a major cause of winter house fires. The Chisholm Twp. Fire Dept. encourages you to use power safely by:

- Checking electrical and extension cords for nicks and fraying and replacing worn cords.
- Never running cords under rugs.
- Using extension cords for temporary connections. Never link a cord to a cord, or a power bar to another power bar.
- Plugging appliances with heavy draws, such as space heaters, microwaves and toaster ovens directly into an outlet, not into extension cords and power bars.
- Using only one power bar per electrical outlet.
- Using power bars to supply appliances with that draw relatively little electricity, including radios, desk lamps, and home computers.

ICE FISHING SAFETY

Before venturing out:

- Check ice conditions with local ice hut operators or other anglers.
- Let others know where you're planning to fish and when you plan to return
- Wear appropriate clothing and equipment are critical to safety and comfort, be prepared for an emergency with equipment such as whistle, cell phone, ice picks, floatation suit, etc.

Recommended Minimum Ice Thickness for New Clear Hard Ice.

No ice is without some risk. Be sure to measure clear hard ice in several places.

3" (7 cm) or less STAY OFF!

4" (10 cm) ice fishing, walking, cross country skiing

5" (12 cm) one vehicle - snowmobile or ATV

8-12" (20-30 cm) one vehicle - car or small pick-up

12-15" (30-38 cm) one vehicle - medium truck
