The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is responsible for compiling information from eligible Ontario voters to create a Preliminary List of Electors for municipal and school board elections.

aware Please be of everyone who uses the and please slow roads, down and move over when passing individuals who may be walking, or on horses, buggies etc. our goal is to keep our roads safe.

SNOW REMOVAL - By-Law 2019-28

Please remember that no person shall, unless authorized "deposit or cause to be deposited any snow or ice upon any portion of any road or bridge located within the limits of the Township.

The Chisholm Twp. Fire Dept. urges you to stay warm and safe — this winter:

- Have your fuel-burning appliances inspected annually by a registered fuel contractor. to COSafety.ca to find a contractor near you.
- Keep chimneys and intake/exhaust vents for furnaces and heating appliances free of debris, ice and snow to reduce the risk of carbon monoxide build-up from inefficient combustion.
- Burn dry, well-seasoned wood in fireplaces and woodstoves.
- Allow ashes from your fireplace or woodstove to cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid. Keep the container outside.
- Keep space heaters at least one metre (3 feet) away from anything that can burn, including curtains, upholstery and clothing.
- · Replace worn or damaged electrical wires and connections on vehicles and extension cords and use the proper gauge extension cord for block heaters.
- Use a timer to reduce the use of your block heater.
- · Never leave your vehicle running inside a garage or building.
- Ensure there is a working smoke alarm on every storey and outside all sleeping areas of your home.
- Install CO alarms to alert you to the presence of this deadly gas.

The Ontario Fire Code requires smoke alarms to be installed on every storey of your home and outside all sleeping areas. Carbon monoxide alarms are required outside all sleeping areas if the home has a fuel-burning appliance, a fireplace or an attached garage. Attention Snowmobilers!

Few things to please be reminded of:

- The speed limit on all roads in Chisholm is 1. 60 km/hr.
- 2. You are sharing the roads with other vehicles, pedestrians, horses, and horse and buggies so please slow down.
- No riding 2 and 3 abreast on the travelled 3. roads.
- Make sure you stop at all municipal road 4. crossings.
- 5. There is no parking on roads that could hinder snow plowing during the months of December, January, February, March and April.
- There will be "use at your own risk" parking 6. for trucks and trailers in the field just above the tennis courts at 51 Bellcairn Road.

Some may think that these reminders are not needed but they are. These are the complaints that the township receives.
