1. CALL TO ORDER

Meeting called to order by Chairperson, Gail Degagne @ 7:03 p.m.

2. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Resolution 2023 – 12(REC)

4. BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES

- (a) 4-H Canada: Deferred – Nicole Tran (absent).
(Nicole Tran has e-mailed 4-H Canada seeking information and guidance and will follow up with them further. Faye Pigeau has offered to help, and Linda Plant is the contact for 4-H.
- (b) Agriculture Day: Kendra Dehaan advised that the biggest concerns some of the vendors had been the high cost that was involved for them to obtain the required insurance for a one-day event. When the event is revisited, then the Township will contact their own insurance company and see if their existing insurance policy would cover such an event and if not any possible options.

Tentative date for Chisholm Agriculture Day has been set for Saturday May 4, 2024. The Recreation Committee would start advertising this event months in advance to provide an abundance of notice to any possible vendors.

- (c) Bottle Drive Shed: Monique is to talk to Jenny and the Public Works Department to see if they would be able to possibly pick up and build the shed that's to be ordered. Talk to Shawn as well re bin sizes recommended.

Monique is to look again at the sheds available for the available budget, and email pictures to the recreation committee for their feedback.

- (d) Beach Toy/Borrow Bin:

One person doated beach toys and the Rec. Committee will use the old beach toys that are currently in the beach shed and Kendra Dehaan will donate the bin. Kendra will drop the bin off at the garage so that we can ask the roads department to drill a few holes in it for the chain and lock (to be purchased). A laminated list of the "Rules/Guidelines" for the rules will be provided and taped to the bin as well.

- (e) The memo received from CAO Clerk, Jenny Leblond re – floating raft was reviewed and discussed. At this time, a donated raft is not possible.

5. Open Forum:

- (a) Designated Dog Area at the Beach: People having their dogs at the beaches and off leash continues to be an ongoing problem, and the Rec. Committee was wondering if having a "designated dog area" could be a possibility. Monique to contact the North Bay Health Unit to see if "dogs not allowed" is a Health Unit rule or regulation?

The Rec. Committee would like to have the By-law Officer's presence be made at the beach.

- (b) Walking Book Tour: Gail to provide Monique with 2-3 copies of the same book to be laminated, and replace the existing book. Once new book has been posted we will readvertise it.

- (c) Alderdale Sign: Bernie provided Kendra with authorization to proceed with the repairs (for free) with the products being donated by Algonquin Pallets and Maple Creek and labor by Matt Dehaan and Brooks Tran.

Kendra is to contact Gail when they are ready to start the work, and Bernie will provide Kendra with Don Butterworths contact information so that she can reach out to him as well.

- (d) Truck Day 2023: Monique advised the Rec. Committee that the Township does not have a 'firm' delivery date for the new truck. Tentative Truck Day has been set for October 9, 2023 (Thanksgiving Weekend).

6. New Business

- (a) Flyer was reviewed with minor changes, that are to be made by Monique and e-mailed to the Rec. Committee for feedback.

Shawn is going to look into Nipissing and see what they have done and will get back to me.

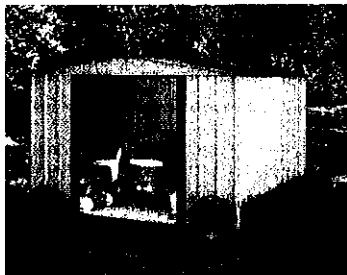
If we were to proceed with this one, then the roads department would pick it up and assemble it.

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THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CHISHOLM
BY-LAW 2001-16

Being a by-law to provide for the protection, enjoyment and use of public beaches and recreation areas located in Chisholm Township namely Laporte Park (Con. 15, Pt. Lot 18 & 19); Wasi Beach (Con. 13, Pt. Lot 15 & 16); Jubilee Park (Con.13, Pt. Lot 6); Tennis Court (Con. 10, Pt. Lot 5); Ball Park (Con. 10, Pt. Lot 16)

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to enact a by-law under the provisions of Section 191, subsection 6 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. M.45, as amended to date, and Section 35 (1) of the Liquor Licence Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. L. 19, as amended to date.

AND WHEREAS all public beaches and recreation areas, being Township property as listed within the Township of Chisholm are for the use, benefit and pleasure of the public and it is desirable to prevent any person from interfering with such enjoyment by the public of the same.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Chisholm enacts as follows:

1. **DEFINITIONS**

- a) The term "public beach" used herein shall be construed to include all lands known as Laporte Park, Wasi Beach and all buildings and waters leased or owned by the Township of Chisholm bordering on Wistiwasung Lake in the said Township, being those Parts of Lots 18 and 19 on Concession 15 and of Lots 15 and 16, Concession 13, on Lake Wistiwasung.
 - b) The term "recreation areas" used herein shall be construed to include all lands and buildings owned by the Township of Chisholm, i.e. Jubilee Park (Concession 13, Pt. Lot 6); Tennis Court (Concession 10, Pt. Lot 5); Ball Park (Concession 10, Pt. Lot 16).
 - c) The term "Council" used herein shall mean the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Chisholm.
2. No person shall cut, remove, climb, break, injure, deface or disturb any tree, shrub, plant, rock, building, table, bleacher, cage, pen, monument, fence, bench, apparatus or property or to pluck, pull up, cut, take or remove any shrub, bush, plant or flower, injure any grass, or to mark or write upon any building, monument, fence, bench or other structure on Township of Chisholm owned property, buildings and/or leased properties.
 3. No person shall operate any motor-driven vehicle elsewhere than on the roads or drives provided for such purpose in any of the aforementioned areas.
 4. No person shall bring an animal on public beach areas and/or recreational areas.
 5. No person shall hitch or fasten any animal except at such places specifically designated for such purposes.
 6. No person shall make or kindle a fire for any purpose, except for appliances such as propane and/or charcoal BBQ's that allow for cooking of food.

7. No person shall carry or discharge any firearms, firecrackers, rockets, torpedoes, bows and arrows, air guns, catapults or fireworks, without the written authority of the Council.
8. No person shall camp or lodge thereon at the aforementioned public beaches and recreation areas.
9. On such public areas, no person shall sell or offer for sale or expose any merchandise, article or anything for immediate or future delivery or any art, skill or service to be exercised or performed immediately or in the future without the written authority of the Council.
10. No person shall engage in any team game on such public areas excepting at such places as shall be especially set apart for such purpose.
11. No bicycles are allowed in or on any designated beach or play area.
12. No person shall scatter, drop or leave anywhere on the said public areas, except in the receptacles provided for the deposit of refuse therein, any piece of paper, rag, garbage, empty bottles or any glass articles or broken glass or rubbish of any kind.
13. No person shall enter any place where the sign "No Admittance" is displayed.
14. No persons shall indulge in riotous, boisterous, threatening or indecent conduct, profane or indecent language or abuse or threaten any other person in such public areas.
15. No person shall accost, annoy or in any way interfere with any other person visiting such public beaches and recreation areas.
16. No person or persons shall create a nuisance by loitering, spying, frightening, annoying or generally making himself, herself or themselves objectionable to other persons peaceably and lawfully enjoying the public beach and recreation area privileges.
17. No person shall commit any disorderly or immoral act or endeavor to entice any individual from public view.
18. No person may launch a boat from any other than a designated area, i.e. Laporte Park.
19. No person shall consume or have liquor at the public beach or recreation areas.
20. **ENFORCEMENT**
 - a) The Township By-law Enforcement Officer or O.P.P. shall be empowered without warrant at all times, to enter the premises or change houses or other buildings on the public beach areas for the purpose of arresting violators of rules and may use all lawful and necessary means to attain that end.
 - b) The Township By-law Enforcement Officer or O.P.P. shall be empowered without warrant at all times, to enter the aforementioned recreation areas for the purpose of arresting violators of rules and may use all lawful and necessary means to attain that end.
21. Any person frequenting the public beach after 11:00 p.m. and before 6:00 a.m. who fails to account satisfactorily for his or her presence or by his or her conduct makes himself or herself objectionable and fails to obey lawful orders to leave the said area, may be apprehended as a trespasser.

22. **SEVERABILITY**


If a court of competent jurisdiction should declare any section or part of any section of this by-law to be invalid, such section or part of a section shall not be construed as having persuaded or influenced council to pass the remainder of the by-law and it is hereby declared the remainder of the by-law shall be valid and shall remain in force.

23. **PENALTY**

- a) Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law may be subject to a fine of not less than one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) with provisions for payment to be made to the Ontario Court of Justice, North Bay, within seven (7) days of the date of such offence, and all fines levied under the provisions of Schedule "A" of this by-law are recoverable under the Provincial Offences Act.
- b) Every person who contravenes any provisions of this by-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine not exceeding the maximum provided under the Provincial Offences Act, exclusive of costs and every fine shall be recoverable under the Provincial Offences Act.

This by-law cancels and supersedes By-law No. 99-06.

Read a first, second and third time and passed this 12th day of June , 2001.
